His ground-level account reveals how the flawed approach adopted by senior officials at the Pentagon--captured in the mantra "brief stay, light touch"--resulted in severe troop shortages and an inadequate plan for post-war stabilization. An insider's account of what really goes on in a war zone, *Liberate and Leave* provides a personal tour of the weeks and months before and after the "liberation"--the secret planning process with all its complexities and doubts; attempts to set up a new government amidst lawlessness and looting; painfully vexing policy decisions set against dramatic discoveries of Saddam's torture chambers and obscenely lavish personal palaces. A searing indictment of a military command utterly out of touch with practical reality, this book, written in a clear, accessible style, offers much-needed insight into how the ways of war and the ways of the world inevitably intersect--and diverge--in our day.
